Camp Policies and Guidelines

We are committed to our guests having a great time in this beautiful place! So **please DO follow these policies**:

- All fish filleting must be done by BNC staff unless previously authorized. No fish cleaning in the cabins.
- We are dedicated to conserving and growing our trophy fishery! Since we are all stewards of the lake, Northern Pike over 27 inches and Walleye over 18 inches must be released.
- Appliances are **not** allowed **except** when **medically necessary**.
- Stove-top percolators are provided in each cabin. Please leave your coffee makers at home.
- Fish cookers are supplied at camp. Please do **not** bring one. We have propane cookers and charcoal grills outside each cabin for cooking fish/meat outdoors when possible.
- Pots and pans are provided in each cabin. (Electric griddles stress out our electrical system so are *not* allowed.)
- State-of-the-art filtered water is available at every faucet in camp! No bottled water may be brought to camp.
- For **sports drinks**, use **powdered mixes** and no plastic bottles. Bring **soda pop** in **cans**.
- Beer may be brought in cans only.
- NO Marijuana in camp.
- We are a camp in **bear country**. **Eat your food inside the cabin**, not on the porch.
- · No pets allowed.

Arrivals & Departures

Our loading dock is **adjacent to Red Lake Marine** on Highway 105 in Red Lake and we will meet you at your assigned pickup time. **Parking** for your vehicle by our dock is free.

On Saturdays and Sundays, pick ups are in the morning or early afternoon. Departures from camp are usually on Friday and Saturday mornings. Always, our boat **schedules are weather-dependent**.

Things to bring

Since we are in a remote location requiring a boat ride into camp, we ask you to **bring only what is necessary**. We can fit more people in the cabin cruiser when everyone brings less! That means **more fishing time for you!** Here are some items to **bring**:

- Excellent rain wear and waterproof boots
- Clothing for both warm and cool weather. Bring your swim suit and long underwear in May and September especially! Average high temps: May 60s, June 70s, July and August 75-85, September 60s. T-shirts and jeans or shorts with lightweight boots or sneakers are comfortable almost all summer. Bring a jacket for morning and evenings. Remember sunscreen, lip balm, and spare car keys!
- Housekeeping guests: plan out your meals and snacks to spend less on groceries. When possible, support the local Red Lake community by purchasing your groceries there. Ask them to pack it in boxes for you. All leftover food must leave camp with guest.
- An **insulated drink canteen** for each person to fill with our purified water; bring in the boat.
- Fishing gear, etc...strategically LIMIT what you bring since there is limited space in the boat to and from camp.
- Toiletries and Towels: WE provide dish soap, hand soap, toilet paper, kitchen towels & bed linens. YOU bring bath towels/wash cloths, shampoo, bath soap, etc.
- · Bait: purchase ahead of time if needed
- **Do** <u>not</u> **bring** large coolers of ice or huge duffel bags. Pack in "Rubbermaid" totes if possible and label.



Gratuities

Our staff works long hours in all kinds of weather to make your trip as enjoyable and relaxing as possible. Many guests acknowledge this dedicated service with a gratuity at the end of the week. The amount is strictly up to you, but 10% of the final bill is frequently used as a guideline.

Licenses

The required Ontario Outdoors Card and Fishing License can be purchased from home at https://www.ontario.ca/page/fishing-licence-non-residents-canada or at any authorized Ontario licenser BEFORE going to camp. Be sure to print and store them both in your tackle box right away so you have them at camp. Being a conservation-minded camp, Bow Narrows will happily credit each guest invoice for their 8-day Conservation license purchased.

Crossing the Border

Canada is a friendly country and welcomes its neighbors from the US! All must have a **valid passport**. More info is at https://travel.state.gov. **All COVID restrictions have been lifted, so no vaccination requirement.**

If you are crossing the border with a minor, be sure to bring a notarized parental consent form. Read more about this at the website listed below.

Canada has regulations about crossing the border when you have been **convicted of offenses such as DUI**.

Bringing Your Own Boat

Yes, it is allowed. 12 Imperial (15 U.S.) gallons of gasoline are included per week. You must park your boat trailer for a fee in a different location in Red Lake. Also bring 200 ft of extension cord if you need to plug in your boat at camp.
